The total amount of donations was donated American Red Cross International. In addition to the number the money that was raised, the Red Cross been matched 100%.





In addition to the matched funds we will receive from the International Monetary Fund, your foundation will have a tremendous impact on the work we are able to do in Nepal. We, at the American Red Cross, have been overwhelmed by the generosity of so many, like the Tu Bi Foundation, which has allowed us to raise over \$25 million to support relief and recovery efforts in Nepal. *Thank you for enabling our work.*

The 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated Nepal on April 25, with powerful aftershocks causing additional damage and loss of life. The earthquakes and aftershocks - including a 7.3 magnitude quake on May 12 - have taken more than 8,600 lives, injured thousands and left more than 800,000 homes destroyed or damaged. As many as 8 million people, nearly a third of the country's population, have been affected.

Following the earthquake, the American Red Cross responded by mobilizing cash support, prepositioning relief supplies, and deploying disaster response experts. Since we had already implemented recovery and preparedness programs in conjunction with the Nepal Red Cross, reaction to this disaster was even more immediate. The remarkable generosity of our supporters - individuals, corporations and foundations like yours - drives our ability to provide relief and assist our partners in the global Red Cross network.

Over the next year, you will continue to receive updates regarding our work in Nepal so you can see the impact of your giving.
